A STUDY TO FIND OUT THE EFFECTIVENESS OF INDUSTRIAL
ATTACHMENT SUPERVISION OF NATIONAL CERTIFICATE STUDENTS IN
INDUSTRIAL CLOTHING DESIGN AT DANHIKO VOCATIONAL TRAINING

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## **ABSTRACT**

The purpose of this study was to investigate the effectiveness of industrial attachment supervision of National Certificate students in Industrial Clothing Design at Danhiko Vocational Training Center.

Data was gathered through the use of 2 questionnaires one for a sample of twenty National Certificate students and another one for four lines supervisors from different companies and an interview schedule for four lecturers in the department of Industrial Clothing Design.

The study revealed that industrial attachment supervision aim at training, motivating, guiding and evaluating trainees. Supervisors also serve as models for development of solid work habits such as punctuality, dependability, co-operation, honest and efficiency. Students were also exposed to the real world of work; it brought learning directly to be on reality.

However, lecturers in the department of Industrial Clothing Design felt that, immediate action was necessary in some aspects of industrial attachment supervision for it to be more effective. Aspects like lecturer funding to make industrial follow-ups and placement.
